What is the EORC?






Remember: you do not need to be an expert!

While we may not be in a place to resolve these barriers, we can help students navigate these barriers!




Key Influencers

- **Guidance Counsellors & Grad Coaches**
- Sports Coaches, Spiritual Leaders, Community Organizations, etc.

Community

Students need to know they are not the only one who has faced these barriers!



 Representation can be found at the student/peer level, among staff, and among faculty members


 Focus on excellence - not only are there people here with similar experiences to you, but they succeed as well

Funding Opportunities

- There are typically special entrance awards and scholarships for students from equity-deserving groups
- Expand outside your institution funding can come from religious institutions, local government centres, and local organizations
- Equality vs equity ≠ gatekeeping



What impacts a student's decision?

Some key items students may want to know if they are experiencing barriers to education

- Campus Community Opportunities
 - How can students with barriers receive support at your institution?
 - How can students meet other people in the community with similar experiences to them?
 - Expand outside campus what opportunities in the city are there to engage in their own community/ culture (ie. cultural foods, haircare, religious institutions, etc.)
 - How far is your school from their hometown, and how will they get home for holidays and breaks?
