Transcripts from Ontario Universities and Colleges

- If you attended or are currently enrolled at an Ontario university or college, you must request transcripts through your application.
 - You will pay for any requested Ontario transcripts as part of the "Submit" process.
 Fees are non-refundable.
 - If you added a request for your Ontario postsecondary transcript you will not see the status of this request until your online application has been submitted.

Secondary (High) Schools Transcripts

- If you attended an Ontario secondary school, you may be eligible to request your official secondary school transcript electronically (completed courses only).

- Official transcripts are required for each college, CEGEP, university, junior college, graduate school or other postsecondary institution you attend/have attended/have withdrawn from
- The OUAC has established procedures with some institutions outside of Ontario to release their transcripts by electronic means. The collection of electronic transcripts is not an automated process.
